

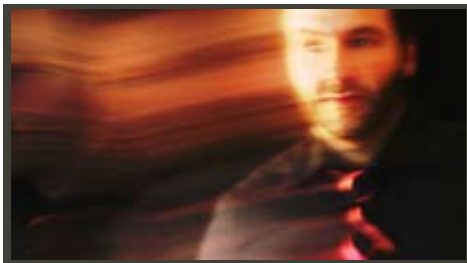
# Art Diary

So much went on during the month of February at the **Beauchamp Art Galleries**. It may have been a short month, but it was certainly filled with lots of activities!

## A new artist: François Samson

The month started off with the arrival of a new artist at the Contemporary Beauchamp Art Gallery. The long awaited paintings of François Samson arrived at the Beauchamp Art Gallery, located at 69, rue St-Pierre and 28, rue du Sault-au-Matelot, Quebec, in the afternoon, on the 5th of February. It was an exciting time for both customers and employees since this artist's talent is remarkable and his paintings are breathtaking. The numerous themes he exploits are interesting; they vary from 'backyard', 'spheres', to 'sand houses'.

All of Samson's paintings are highly textured and behold rich organic colours, where life and light both seem to burst out of each one of his paintings. Besides beholding these qualities, Samson also creates his own



canvases. He has invented a unique sculptural technique which consists of pulling back the canvas inside the frame. These are trademark items of his work.

The first week of February ended with the creation of another masterpiece. On Saturday the 7th and Sunday the 8th of February, at the Beauchamp Royal Art Gallery, located at 53, rue St-Pierre, many visitors came to admire the works of Aline Brochu.



This Quebec artist has been painting for over 25 years and has been exhibiting her paintings at the Beauchamp Royal Art Gallery for the past 15 years. Aline Brochu's apparition was a real privilege; she actually painted a piece right before the enthused viewers. What started as a blank canvas on Saturday afternoon, finished as a masterpiece by the end of Sunday. Aline Brochu titled her piece Quebec Dimanche le 8 Fevrier 1925, and the painting was sold on Sunday the 22nd of February.

This event was certainly an experience for the senses, and what a sight it was for the eyes as both artists work so differently. St-Aubin uses vigorous and energetic brushstrokes that well depict his paintings, and the vibrant colours that he uses also capture the essence of his character. Bluto, on the other hand, uses brushstrokes that are as soft and sensual as are her paintings. Her colour scheme is also very representative of how gentle and sensitive she is.

Carl Camiré brought 15 new paintings to the event and answered questions on what motivates him to paint and on
