His work can also be found in many corporate and private collections including: Cirque du Soleil, Musée du Bas Saint-Laurent, Holt Renfrew, Head Research, Corporation Fortune, Hélène Garant, Gentec Inc., and Bagel Tradition'l.

Mélan; Mélanie Simard... A Promising Artist...

In its spring edition, Magazin' Art, a very sought out Art Magazine from Quebec, has designated a special tribute to Melanie Simard.

This young artist, also known as Mélan, has been exhibiting her two styles of painting at the Beauchamp Art Galleries for the past seven years.



Born in 1975, in Boischatel, Quebec, Mélanie Simard was fascinated by all art forms as early as nine years old. Now, as an adult, Simard juggles her two careers brilliantly; that of a graphic artist and that of a painter. Her paintings also

Another New Artist at the Beauchamp Art Galleries for the Month of March...



The Beauchamp Royal and Associates Art Gallery located at 124, cote de la Montagne, received another prestigious artist to their collection: Irena Koulikov was born in Kokand, Usbekistan. She studied fine art at Moscow State University in 1986. She also explored her musical talents at Leningrad Conservatory for two years before becoming a choir singer at the Rimsky-Korsakov Opera Theatre. As much as she enjoyed the choir, she left her singing career in 1993 to devote herself to painting on a full time basis.

Now established in Toronto, Koulikov uses acrylic paint on which she applies liquid encaustic; an ancient technique which softens and yellows colours, and renders an aged look to the finished canvas. Koulikov is very much influenced by the 17th Century Dutch Collection as well as by the 19th Century French Barbizon School. In her creative process, her musical background resurfaces through her habit of enjoying listening to classical music while painting.



In her tranquil landscape scenes, the warm rich browns, stark creams, and vibrant reds create a soothing effect to the viewer. One feels serene and at peace when observing the elements that inhabit a Koulikov composition.

Her still life paintings signed Mélan, offer a textured finish. When one views a Mélan

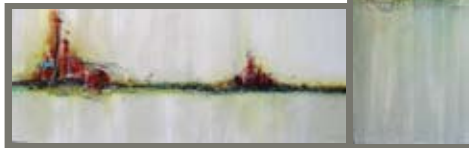


painting, one is overwhelmed by the impulse of 'wanting to touch' the creation before one's eyes. The textures are captivating and the vibrant and pure colours are fascinating. As a finishing touch, Mélan adds a very glossy and thick varnish to her subject, leaving the background matte. The painting is whimsical yet flawless and the overall effect is tantalizing.

Her other paintings, signed Mélanie Simard, have a more abstract side to them. Being very contemporary, they seem more mature and toned-down, yet they are just as enticing. This style is based on a cold and rigid substance called aluminium. Simard mounts the foil on a textured canvas. Here the metal matter takes on a second life, in which Simard then adds the vibrant palette for which she is known for, however, while minimizing the quantity of colour applied.

With her second style, Simard has made her place in the world of contemporary art. Her pieces have even been designated as being 'sure-values' for the Contemporary Art Collectors (as declared in the *Parcours Magazine*). Needless to say, Melanie Simard is a promising artist who has an auspicious career ahead of her, and produces paintings that one must surveil.
