Artists who transform a rigid and cold medium into breathtaking masterpieces...

Most of the artists who exhibit their creations at the Beauchamp Art Galleries work with either acrylic or oil paint, and use various other painting mediums to add texture and depth to their paintings. The duo of artists, Normand-Ferland, brought new pieces at the Contemporary Art Gallery, located at 69, rue St-Pierre and 28, rue Sault-au-Matelot... As well as the mocking rooster with its confident glare and defiant nature...At this same gallery, one may also see the works of Stephane Blouin... pieces of an undeniable sensitivity and fragility.
